TEACHING PROFICIENCIES

Developmental and Remedial Reading

My teaching approach is geared toward activating and elaborating the cognitive processes necessary for independent comprehension. In tutorial recitation, the student is guided to understand as well as remember what he reads by verbalizing the structure and logic of written discourses. Visualization, at first encouraged in listening exercises, and then applied to reading, enhances recall and efficiency. Writing in a variety of patterns facilitates the recognition of the same structures in texts. Intensive tutorial work at all developmental levels has refined my informal diagnostic abilities and equipped me with a wide range of materials and methods.

Developmental and Remedial Writing/Composition

Studies at Rutgers University involved the investigation of developmental sequence in writing, the kind of instructions which elicit higher verbal performance, and the role of expressive writing in the development of analytic skills. Experience as a professional writer in journalistic and literary modes enriches my teaching strategies.
